Entry Requirements	High 5 or above in History, 5 in English Language.
Assessment	<p>Two written exams both 2 hours 30 minutes long.  One on <b>The Tudors: England, 1485–1603.</b>  One on <b>Revolution and dictatorship: Russia, 1917–1953</b></p> <p>Each paper has three questions and are worth 80 marks (40% of A-level for each)</p> <p>Historical Investigation into Civil Rights in America (1860s-1960s) 3,000 – 3,500 words  40 marks (20% of A-level)  This is marked by teachers and then moderated by AQA.</p>

Progression Opportunities	<p>History is a facilitating subject which means it is a subject that universities and employers recognise as valuable qualification.</p> <p>Employers and universities like candidates who have studied history because it teaches to you learn independently; weigh up ideas; evaluate evidence; arrive at supported judgements and present ideas in a way that other people can understand.</p> <p>It is also seen as a valuable qualification as studying history allows you to learn about and understand different cultures and different people and gives you an insight into why our society is the way it is. Our choice of A Level topics allows our students to learn about other countries' histories as well as Britain's.</p> <p>Students that study history enjoy finding out about how different things were in the past for ordinary people and learning about famous historical figures. We support our A level students to question evidence and identify and challenge the arguments of others.</p> <p>History will help you prepare for careers in law, teaching, business, the civil service, television and many other professions. Studying History helps you organise your ideas and such will show writing personal statements and job application.</p>
