- 77% of students get their highest grade in sociology.





- Sociology enables people to question the world around us.






2018 – one student received an A* in sociology which enabled a change in course to forensic psychology.

2019 – one student received an A* after a remark in sociology which was the catalyst for being accepted for his Law course.


