Entry Requirements	A Merit or above is expected in Level 2 Health and Social Studies or Early Years if studied. A Level 5 in at least one science is preferable. 5 in Maths preferred.
Assessment	The qualification is built up from external exams and internally marked coursework. There is an exam on each qualification path, the double and triple qualifications have additional exams. The coursework has a significant impact on the overall grade, therefore this course would suit learners who prefer project based work.
