#### What is an Early Application?

- ▶ All university courses are applied for through UCAS.
- ▶ The deadline for most courses is 15<sup>th</sup> January.
- ▶ Some courses have an earlier deadline of 15<sup>th</sup> October.

- ▶ Courses in Medicine, Dentistry and Veterinary Science
- All courses at the University of Oxford and the University of Cambridge

#### Why are these courses different?

▶ Particularly competitive – most applicants will be predicted at least three As at A level.

Application process often involves additional admissions tests

Require an academic interview

World class facilities


Collegiate structure

- Strong GCSE results
- Good A level predicted grades
- Work experience (for Medicine, Dentistry and Veterinary Science)
- Admissions test scores
- Academic personal statement

- Interview preparation including a mock interview


#### What can I do to prepare?

- Organise work experience (Medicine\*, Dentistry and Veterinary Science)
- Keep up to date with your field
- Look out for Widening Participation opportunities (SOAMS, ADOPT, DISCOVER, UNIQ)
- ► Engage in super curricular exploration

#### Supercurricular Activities

- ▶ Read books, journal articles, newspapers, magazines
- Watch documentaries
- ▶ Listen to Radio 4 podcasts
- Enter competitions (UKMT, Chemistry Challenge, Writing Competitions etc)
- Attend open lectures
- Blog and tweet about your subject and connect to others doing the same
- Travel (especially Geography or Languages but not at the moment!)
- Organise work experience
- ▶ Take the Extended Project Qualification
- ▶ Engage in MOOCs (eg <u>Future Learn</u>)
- Watch iTunes U and TED talks
- Visit museums, galleries and the theatre
